



Building Digital Communities: Pilot

- One in five Americans do not use the internet.
- Online interactions are becoming a daily necessity for individuals and organizations.

Building Digital Communities: Pilot recognizes the importance of information technology access and use for all communities. The Project supports and documents the efforts of local leadership teams in nine pilot communities intent on increasing digital inclusion.

The work is based on **Building Digital Communities: A Framework for Action**, created by IMLS.

Convening Stakeholders

Digital inclusion is a complex, community-wide goal requiring a coalition of local government, education institutions, libraries, community-based organizations, business and residents. The first step recommended in the framework is to “Convene Stakeholders.”



OCLC has partnered with the University of Illinois Center for Digital Inclusion, Waymark Systems, to provide stakeholder engagement expertise and guidance. The project is providing intense support to two communities.

The heroes of this project are the local leadership teams. Dodge City, Kansas, is the first pilot location for the stakeholder alignment process, working with the team of **Cathy Reeves**, Dodge City Public Library Director, **Jane Longmeyer**, Dodge City Public Relations Manager, and **Greta Clark**, Professor and Director of Multi-cultural Education at Dodge City Community College.
