We polled the state's directors, asking them how we could best help


Directors' most common challenges:

- Patrons have limited time at computers
- Reference staff are over-worked
- Hour and budget cutbacks further limited library staff



"Compiling online resources for libraries to access in one place" was the 2nd most requested support, closely following a potential partnership with WA State Employment Security or WorkSource.

Our Response



Immediate: Form task force to create online Hard Times Resource Guide

Next: Plan grant cycle to deliver much needed funds to strapped communities

Ongoing: Conduct online and in-person training, including librarians helping jobseekers

Target: vulnerable populations in the state, especially the unemployed and job-seeking

Focused, Online Help

Patrons have limited time at computers.

- Includes selective, not comprehensive lists. We wanted to avoid information overload
- Layout is very easy to navigate. Users can quickly jump to the section they need.
- Customized queries allow searching only within our resources.



Renew Washington Grants

- Offered targeted LSTA-funded competitive Hard Times grant opportunity to Washington libraries
- Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation offered to match the funding to provide additional grants for public libraries, and Renew Washington was born



 WSL awarded a total of \$644,000 to 17 public libraries and 3 academic libraries as part of the Renew Washington Grant Cycle

Renew WA Libraries are...



- Expanding their education/job information collections
- Purchasing ResumeMaker software
- Improving staff skills so they can lead patrons directly to needed resources
- Featuring a speaker's series of well-regarded experts in the field of career transition and placement
- Holding classes on job-hunting computer skills

Training and Peer Learning

Trainings were offered to library staff in Washington that related to helping patrons during the economic downturn; trainings provided primarily by Amigos and BCR

Peer Learning (Gates Foundation Grant) trained WSL staff in peer learning techniques and online facilitation and will engage Renew Washington sub-grantees in peer learning online
