WHAT IS EXPUNGEMENT?

- "Expungement is the process by which a record of criminal conviction is destroyed or sealed from state or federal record. An expungement order directs the court to treat the criminal conviction as if it had never occurred, essentially removing it from a defendant's criminal record." (American Bar Association)
- Though similar, it is not a pardon.
- Each state has its own laws about eligibility.
- Each state also has its own laws about which offenses may be expunged.
- Example: Driving offenses are not expungable in all states.

WHY EXPUNGEMENT?

- The National Conference of State Legislatures estimates 1 in 3 American adults has a criminal record. (https://www.ncsl.org)
- A Michigan study shows that in the first year after record clearing, the probability of employment rose by 6.5%, wages rose by about 22%, and recidivism dropped to roughly 4%. (Gullen, 2018)
- A California study found that participants who expunged their records showed an average increase in yearly income of \$6,190, and 93% of participants reported confidence in their future job prospects. (Gullen, 2018)
