...a psychological

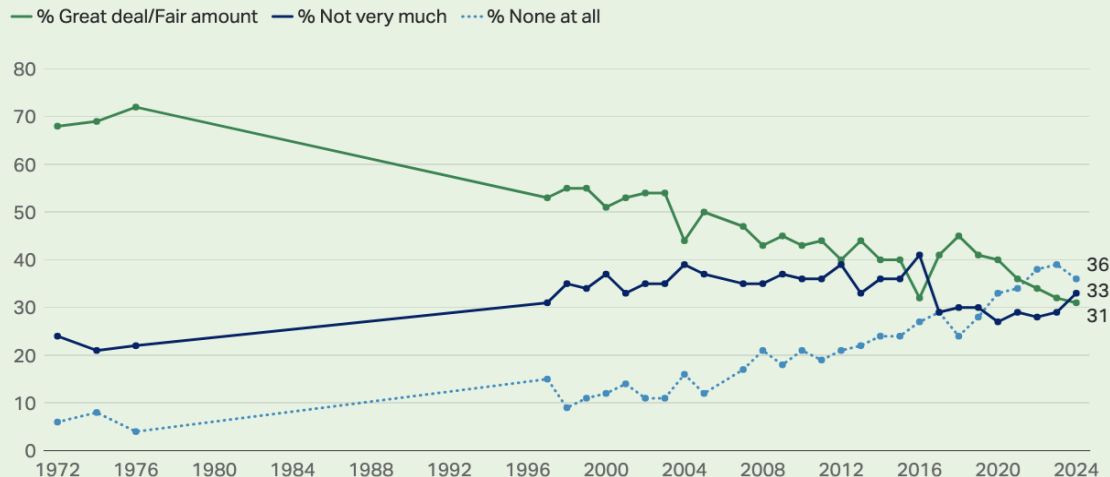

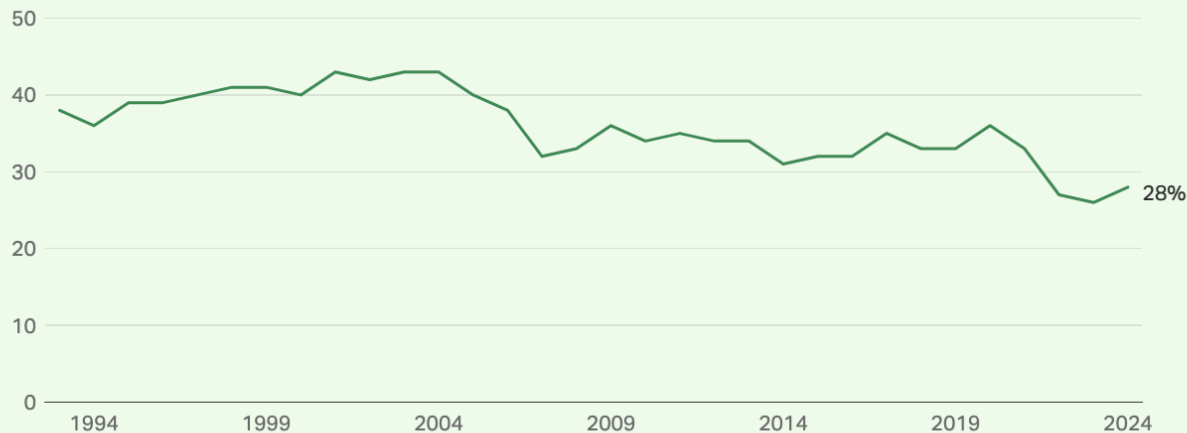
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Distrust extends beyond news media

Average Confidence in Major U.S. Institutions, 1993-2024

Figures are the average percentage of U.S. adults who have a great deal or quite a lot of confidence.



The average includes the 14 institutions rated consistently by Gallup since 1993 -- the church or organized religion, the military, the U.S. Supreme Court, banks, the public schools, newspapers, Congress, television news, organized labor, the presidency, the police, the medical system, the criminal justice system and big business.

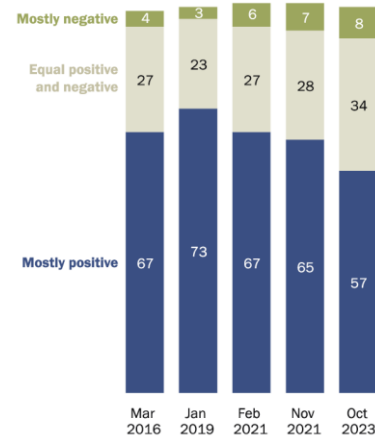
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Distrust extends beyond news media

PEW RESEARCH CENTER

EveryLibrary Institute and Book Riot researchers surveyed 1,527 parents and guardians with children under 18 in two surveys during October and November 2023.

Here's a by-the-numbers look at what parents and guardians told researchers about public libraries:

92 – Percentage of parents, grandparents and guardians who said they trust librarians to curate appropriate books and materials

90 – Percentage who report being comfortable allowing their child to select their own materials

96 – Percentage who said they feel their children are safe within the library

83 – Percentage who agree librarians know what books children love

35 – Percentage who think public librarians have a political agenda, and believe they should

9 – Percentage who do not believe librarians have a political agenda, but think they should

44 – Percentage who don't think librarians have a political agenda, and should not

85 – Percentage who report being satisfied or very satisfied with librarians.

What is driving distrust?

- > The role of credible critique + “healthy skepticism”
- > Polarization and partisan identity
- > Mis- and disinformation campaigns
- > Expanded (albeit lower quality) alternative options
- > Information overwhelm + reduced resources to engage actively with information
- > Lack of relationship building at the individual + community levels



Where do people go when they don't trust traditional sources of information?



The consequences of distrust - a lack of informational gatekeeping

- > Internet access can (ideally) “democratize” information-seeking, yet this is increasingly not the case!
- > When there is some gatekeeping e.g. Google elevating authoritative answers, this still requires skills to recognize (and trust) this information above the rest of search results
- > Lack of desire for gatekeeping + a demonization of informational quality control (as “censorship” or “elitism”)

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What can we do about it?

Case Study:

- Focus groups with local journalists, educators and librarians in Bellingham, WA
- Barriers to and resources for trust-building, resources

Key takeaways:

- Opportunities for local information providers to support one another in trust-building
 - Identifying and sharing potential causes for concern (e.g. misinformation spreading in local online groups)
- Transparency around role definitions - increasingly the public are unaware of what a librarian/journalist/teacher can and can't do.
- Engaging in online community spaces as professionals - being active in local Facebook and Next Door community groups
- Identifying the “moveable middle” and tailoring resources to their needs and concerns

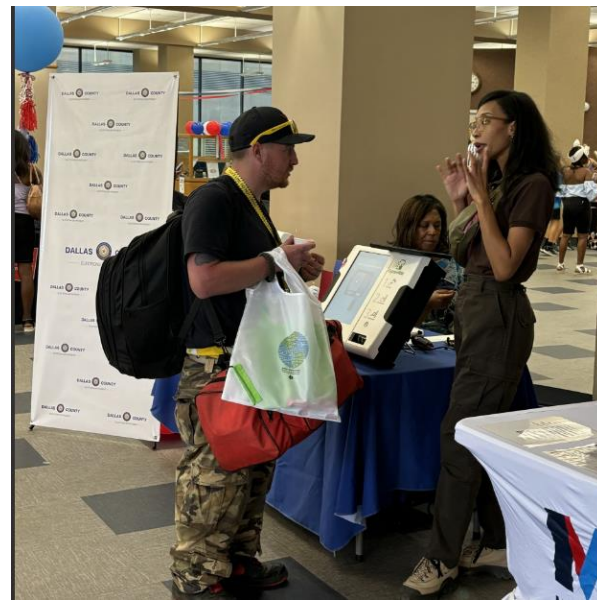

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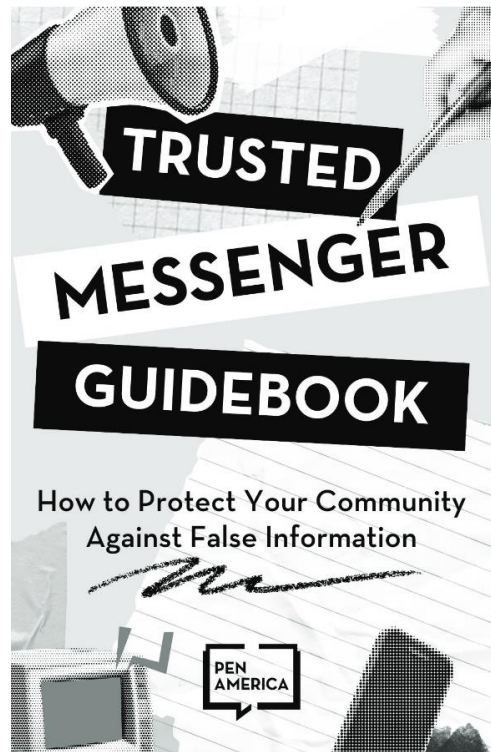

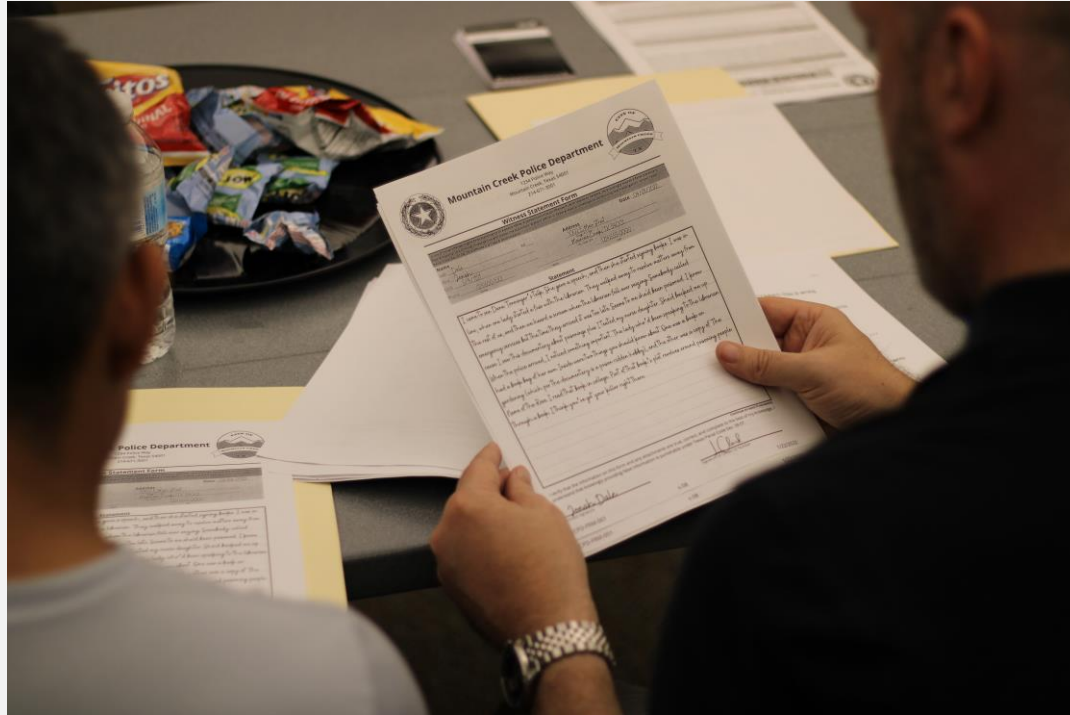
