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Challenges

Vermont Workforce

- Agriculture, health care, education, government and small business are major elements in state's economy
- 6.5% statewide unemployment (March 2010)
 Unemployment rates in individual towns: 3.9% 8.1%
- Net loss of jobs statewide
- Stagnant job creation
- Decline in labor force and net loss of population migration
- Aging workforce; retirees returning to work
- Next Generation: new college graduates and younger population leaving state to find jobs
- Community College enrollment increased 30% in past 5 years
- 80% of future jobs will require post-secondary education



Challenges

Vermont Public Libraries

- 183 independent public libraries
- Only 32 libraries serve populations over 5,000
- No state aid to public libraries
- 25% increase in public computer use in 2009
- Libraries report cuts in staffing and hours of operation
- Limited space in libraries for public computers
- Desperate need for computer training for library staff and general public
- Need high-speed broadband and increased bandwidth to provide online resources for job-seekers

Opportunities for Vermont Public Libraries

e-Vermont: The Community Broadband Project Grant Award: March 2010

- \$2.4 million grant to Vermont Council on Rural Development
- Vermont Department of Libraries is grant partner
- \$69,000 for libraries in 24 towns
- Enhanced public computing in libraries
- Community-wide problem-solving with emphasis on job creation, small business, online resources and services, and training

Vermont Fiber Link

Application pending (Submitted March 2010)

- Comprehensive Community
 Infrastructure application submitted by
 Vermont Telecommunications Authority
- Vermont Department of Libraries is grant partner
- Will bring fiber optic connectivity to 53
 libraries in five rural counties
- Promises faster speeds and increased bandwidth for improved online services and resources in libraries
