





Panels can be opened or closed by clicking on the panel name at the top of the column, or by using the X in the individual panel.


Hover over edge of panels to drag and resize.

 Community libraries train farmers to use ICT and connect farmers with agricultural information in local languages




PLIP Serbia Agriculture

 Library trains farmers to use ICT, runs meetings with experts to improve farming practices, and creates online market to increase their sales




PLIP Ghana Education

 Mobile Library takes laptops with preloaded educational material to schools in villages so that pupils can get hands-on ICT experience and pass their ICT exams




PLIP Lithuania Education

 Library creates an educational game that supports learning of children at risk of dropping out, and re-connects them with their schools




PLIP Macedonia Employment

 Library uses robotics to build computer programming skills of children and youth






Drivers of Community Development in Guatemala and Honduras

Problem

Proposed Solution


