There are two main types of interviews: job interviews and informational interviews. Although the tips and strategies for each type are unique, preparation is key to both.

- Employer brochures
- · Annual business reports
- · Trade periodicals
- · Manufacturers' quides
- Union representatives
- · School placement offices
- Local and state employment service offices
- · Chambers of Commerce
- · Professional organizations
- Current employees

Learn more about how to conduct successful employer research.

Gathering facts about a company helps you answer potential interview questions. It also gives you important information on how to match your skills to the company or position. To complete a successful match, try this exercise:

- 1. Divide a piece of paper in half by drawing a line down the middle.
- On one side, list specific skills, experience and abilities needed by the employer.
- 3. On the other side, write down your qualifications that meet each.



Assess patient health problems and needs, develop and implement nursing care plans, and maintain medical records. Administer nursing care to ill, injured, convalescent, or disabled patients. May advise patients on health maintenance and disease prevention or provide case management. Licensing or registration required, Include advance practice nurses such as: nurse practitioners, clinical nurse specialists, certified nurse midwives, and certified registered nurse anesthetists. Advanced practice nursing is practiced by RNs who have specialized formal, post-basic education and who function in highly autonomous and specialized roles.



### How is O\*NET Used?

O\*NET information is relevant to many different audiences.

- Counselors: Connect people to appropriate occupations with resources like the <u>Career Exploration Tools</u>, <u>O\*NET OnLine</u>, and OnLine's <u>Skills Search</u>. If you need to find an O\*NET-SOC code for an existing job, try the keyword search at <u>O\*NET Code Connector</u>.
- Students/Job Seekers: Discover occupations by taking the <u>Computerized Interest Profiler</u> and <u>Work Importance Profiler</u> assessments right from your PC. If you've already got an occupation in mind, learn more about it from <u>O\*NET OnLine</u>.



# What Do They Do?

### Tasks

- Maintain contact with fire dispatchers at all times to notify them of the need for additional firefighters and supplies, or to detail any difficulties encountered.
- Rescue fire victims, and administer emergency medical aid.
- Collaborate with other firefighters as a member of a firefighting crew.
- Patrol burned areas after fires to locate and eliminate hot spots that may restart fires.

# What Skills Do They Have?

#### Skills

Active Listening — Giving full attention to what other people are saying, taking time to understand the points being made, asking questions as appropriate, and not interrupting at inappropriate times.

Equipment Maintenance — Performing routine maintenance on equipment and determining when and what kind of maintenance is needed.

Judgment and Decision Making — Considering the relative costs and benefits of potential actions to choose the most appropriate one.

Service Orientation — Actively looking for ways to help people.

Equipment Selection — Determining the kind of tools and equipment needed to do a job.

Coordination — Adjusting actions in relation to others' actions.

Instructing — Teaching others how to do something.

Operation Monitoring — Watching gauges, dials, or other indicators to make sure a machine is working properly.

Complex Problem Solving — Identifying complex problems and reviewing related information to develop and evaluate options and implement solutions.

Operation and Control — Controlling operations of equipment or systems.

# What Abilities Do They Use?

#### **Abilities**

Problem Sensitivity — The ability to tell when something is wrong or is likely to go wrong. It does not involve solving the problem, only recognizing there is a problem.

Oral Comprehension — The ability to listen to and understand information and ideas presented through spoken words and sentences.

Oral Expression — The ability to communicate information and ideas in speaking so others will understand.

Speech Clarity — The ability to speak clearly so others can understand you.

Deductive Reasoning — The ability to apply general rules to specific problems to produce answers that make sense.

Inductive Reasoning — The ability to combine pieces of information to form general rules or conclusions (includes finding a relationship among seemingly unrelated events).

Speech Recognition — The ability to identify and understand the speech of another person.

Selective Attention — The ability to concentrate on a task over a period of time without being distracted.

**Speed of Limb Movement** — The ability to quickly move the arms and legs.

Stamina — The ability to exert yourself physically over long periods of time without getting winded or out of breath.
